## Milk Painting

Using compasses and rulers, draw circles and triangles on white paper to make ice cream cones. Add food coloring to sweetened condensed or evaporated milk to create paint. Sponge-paint the circles and triangles. They will shine and drip – just like real ice cream! After the shapes dry, cut them out and assemble the ice cream cones. Make sure you don't use too much paint,

because it will take longer to dry.

## Cow Puppet

Materials needed:

Paper lunch bag (preferably white)

Black paint

Circle-shaped sponge

Construction paper or felt

Glue

Instructions:

Use a white paper lunch bag if you can. Use the construction paper or markers to make a face on the bottom of the paper bag. The mouth will be on the bottom edge where the bag is folded. You can also use felt and cut out eyes, nose, etc. Cut small, pointy ear shapes out of construction paper and glue them to the side of the bottom edge of the paper bag. Once your face is drawn, you can finish making your cow by giving it black spots. Dip a small, round sponge into black paint and dab it on the bag. Set it aside until the paint dries.

## TP Cows

### Materials needed:

- Empty toilet paper roll for each child
- Scissors
- Invisible tape
- Glue
- Crayons
- Copies of the attached "cow parts" page

### Instructions:

Have the kids wrap their toilet paper rolls with a piece of white paper. Fasten with a piece of tape.

Next, have the kids color the cow parts on the attached page, "Crazy Cow Crafts II-Cow Parts." When they're finished coloring, they may cut each part out and glue the parts to the "body" of the cow — the toilet paper roll —beginning with the head at one of the roll's hollow ends.
